

## ENGLISH 9 GRADING POLICY

- The Archbold High School grading scale will be used for all grading unless otherwise indicated.

93 – 100 = A	73 – 76 = C
90 – 92 = A-	70 – 72 = C-
87 – 89 = B+	67 – 69 = D+
83 – 86 = B	63 – 66 = D
80 – 82 = B-	60 – 62 = D-
77 – 79 = C+	Below 60 = F
- Students must check the English 9 Moodle class page daily for class activities and assignments. In addition, Google Classroom will be used as needed.
- All tests and quizzes will be announced, usually several days in advance.
- Homework will be assigned nearly every day. Most homework will be graded.
- All assignments are due at the beginning of the class period on the day they are due in order to receive credit. No late assignments will be accepted.
- Students are expected to be in assigned seats when the bell rings, with all needed supplies in backpacks. Backpacks must be kept under desks and out of the aisles.
- No food or drinks, other than water, are allowed in the classroom.
- All students are expected to participate in each class period they attend. Participation means giving full attention to the class work. Sleeping, doing unrelated homework, texting, playing games on the iPad, sending social messages on the iPad, taking class pictures on the iPad, recording class activities on the iPad, being plugged in to the iPad via ear buds, etc. will not be permitted, unless instructed to do so by the teacher.
- Make-up work will be accepted for excused absences only.
  - A student must consult with the teacher before or after class on the day he/she returns to school after an absence to make arrangements to make up missed work before school, after school, or during a studyhall.
  - Any assignment the student was aware of before his/her absence is due the day the student returns to school unless other arrangements are made with the teacher.
  - A student will not receive credit for make-up work turned in after the established due date unless an extension was arranged with the teacher.
- Cheating will not be tolerated. This includes plagiarism, and/or students giving or receiving answers and/or information on any graded assignments, tests, etc. in verbal, electronic, or hard copy form. Cheating will result in no credit for any work involved. See the Academic Dishonesty section of the Student Handbook for additional consequences.
- Final nine-weeks grades will be figured by the percentage of the total possible points a student receives.
